## The character of Pastors, Elders and HG leaders

1 Timothy 4:7,8 'train yourself to be godly...godliness has value for all things.'

We should all aspire to the same quality Christian character that is expected of Elders/Deacons.

#### Two forms of Elder in 1Timothy 5:17

Clearly not all are qualified for 'preaching and teaching' but all 'direct the affairs of the church'.

Therefore 'able to teach' (1 Tim.3:2) must refer to something other than able to publicly instruct a congregation in preaching.

also in Ephesians 4:11 Paul refers to 'pastors and teacher' but with no reference to Elders.

Whilst all Elders have a pastoral responsibility, some are gifted for 'preaching and teaching'. For this reason our senior leaders of the Elders are referred to as 'Pastors'.

### Godliness and godly lives

# Titus 1:1 'Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ for the faith of God's elect and the knowledge of the truth that leads to <u>godliness.</u>'

Godliness and godly lives are reoccurring themes in the pastoral letters of the New Testament.

The word is *eusebeia* ( $\epsilon \dot{\upsilon} \sigma \epsilon \beta \epsilon \iota \alpha$ ) godliness, piety towards God in everything. 'Devotion to God actively expressed in a good life empowered by the gospel'.

When Peter suggests God has given us 'everything we need for a godly life' (2 Peter 1:3) the context indicates this refers to the word of God ('precious promises') and the Holy Spirit ('divine nature').

1 Timothy 4:7,8 'train yourself to be godly...godliness has value for all things.'

6:3 'the sound instruction of our Lord Jesus Christ and to godly teaching'

6:11 'pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness.'

- 2 Timothy 3:12 'everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.'
- Titus 1:1 'Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ for the faith of God's elect and the knowledge of the truth that leads to <u>godliness.</u>'
- Titus 2:11,12 'The grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men. <sup>12</sup> It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and <u>godly lives</u> in this present age.'
- 2 Peter 1:3 'His divine power has given us everything we need for <u>a godly life</u> through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.
  - 1:5–7 'make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; <sup>6</sup> and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, <u>godliness</u>; <sup>7</sup> and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love.'
  - 3:11 'what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives.'
