### Introduction

- ⇒ The Smartphone is not neutral, it is a piece of technology that changes us as we use it
- ⇒ Technology has always changed us (eg. Printing press, radio, television)
- ⇒ The worst thing we can do is to regard technology as neutral

## **How Smartphones Change Us**

- $\Rightarrow$  They have made some aspects of life easier!
- ⇒ But beware lest we become like the idolaters of psalm 115; 'those who make them become like them; so do all who trust in them'
  - o Smartphones distract us mentally
  - o Smartphones distract us from embodied relationships

## **Biblical Principles**

- 1. Listen to Jesus first (Luke 10:38-42)
- 2. Prioritize embodied relationships (John 1:14)
- 3. Use your phone in a godly way (Philippians 4:8)
- 4. Be a creator, not just a consumer (Genesis 9:7)

- Buy an alarm clock
- Use focus and do-not-disturb settings
- Develop a social media mission statement

- ⇒ Let us be formed by Christ, not by technology.
- ⇒ Let us beware that we are not, 'welcoming the frenziedness into our souls.'2
